SHORT PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

* **marked in bold** Indicates larger programs that serve **at least 30** students or youth in Santa Fe through Mentoring, Tutoring & Internship opportunities.

- ❖ *Ampersand Sustainable Learning Center, Sustainable Living Internship* - A 2 month residential program to explore natural building, solar cooking, land restoration, organic gardening, permaculture and community. Hosts up to 8 interns at the off grid demonstration site.
- ❖ ***Big Brothers Big Sisters Mountain Region**** - Provides children facing adversity with strong and enduring, professionally supported 1-to-1 mentoring relationships that change their lives for the better, forever. Partners with parents / guardians, volunteers and others in the community.
- ❖ ***Boys and Girls Clubs of Santa Fe/Del Norte**** - Provides group mentoring, one-on-one mentoring, tutoring, and a teen internship program at 7 clubs in Santa Fe and Rio Arriba Counties.
- ❖ *Casa Milagro* - A community of adult Artists with a disabling mental illness. Welcomes intergenerational exchanges with sensitive, compassionate youth, 16 and older.
- ❖ ***Communities in Schools of New Mexico**** - Provides academic tutors and mentors for 10 schools as designated by SFPS. Tutors work in classrooms with individual students or small groups and in after school programs.
- ❖ *Computer Charity (formerly Cybernetworknm)* - Volunteers help with the majority of the machine renovations. Depending on hardware specs, we install legal copies of Windows 7, OS X or linux. PCs that are too old or damaged are taken apart and recycled, keeping electronic waste out of our landfills.
- ❖ ***City of Santa Fe Economic Development Division**** - The Santa Fe Young Professionals is a summer Internship program designed to match businesses, nonprofits, and government organizations with young talent from New Mexico higher education institutions.
- ❖ ***Embudo Valley Library**** - Offers a teen summer intern program at our library in Rio Arriba County. Also provide school year opportunities for teens to volunteer and do community service at our library.
- ❖ ***Interfaith Coalition for Public Education**** - Recruits volunteers for Math, Computer Science and ESL Tutoring at Santa Fe High School; Medical Program Tutoring at Santa Fe Community College; Math Tutoring at Mandela Magnet School and supporting students at ECO, the new Early College Opportunities Vo-Tech Magnet School.
- ❖ *Interfaith Leadership Alliance of Santa Fe, Envision Program* - Provides mentors for children birth to 18 years of age classified as homeless and enrolled in the Santa Fe Public Schools.
- ❖ ***MATCH New Mexico **** - Helps 3rd graders at risk of academic failure to learn crucial reading, math and social skills needed for academic and life-long success with college student mentors.
- ❖ ***Mesa Prieta Petroglyph Project*** – The Summer Youth Intern Program trains 12 Pueblo and Hispano youth (13-18) in heritage ethics and archaeological recording in northern New Mexico.
- ❖ ***New Mexico Museum of Natural History and Science*** - The Junior Docent program provides teens between 13-17 years old in the 7th -12th grade opportunities to gain hands on experience in the Museum, primarily engaging with the visiting public, but also getting introduced to other behind the scenes opportunities.
- ❖ ***New Mexico Suicide Intervention Project*** - Provides graduate social work and counseling students with internships at its SKY Counseling Center in Santa Fe. Intern students receive hands on training in working with diverse needs of youth with suicidal and other high risk behaviors and their families. The Natural Helpers Peer Helping Program provides Santa Fe middle and high school students with extensive training and mentorship in peer helping skills in how to help themselves and other students cope with and respond in healthier, more positive ways to the problems that may lead to teen suicide or other self-destructive behaviors.
- ❖ *Randall Davey Audubon Center, Audubon New Mexico* - Regularly hires college and post-college interns as part of Audubon's Wings Intern program in the fields of policy, education, and nature center operations. Each summer we also mentor teen volunteers in our Youth Naturalist program at the Randall Davey Audubon Center & Sanctuary.
- ❖ ***Regional Development Corporation Accelerate Program*** - The Accelerate program offers career readiness training and paid internships with regional employers to non-traditional students attending one of the six participating institutions of higher education in northern New Mexico.
- ❖ *Santa Fe Advisors LLC* - Internship program for college level or higher students to provide experience working in the investment management field.
- ❖ *Santa Fe Botanical Garden* - Offers internships for middle school through college students interested in nonprofit management, education, horticulture, and botany.
- ❖ *Santa Fe Chamber of Commerce* - The Workforce Development Committee is in the early stages of recruiting mentors for students. Focusing on job training and workforce development.

- ❖ **Santa Fe Community College** *– offers a broad range of student support services including academic advising, internships and other career services to assist students successfully transition to college, increase the likelihood of academic success and degree completion, and transition to career. Actively partners with local businesses to provide relevant career experiences to students.
- ❖ **Santa Fe Habitat for Humanity** *- Santa Fe Habitat works with Santa Fe Youth Build in a school-year training program for high-risk youth that work at our build site and learn construction skills. We also partner with the Santa Fe Community College with their Youth Build Program and Masters High School, where students do projects at our build sites. In addition to this, we are partners with the Santa Fe University Art & Design and have interns working in our office and Re-Store.
- ❖ **Santa Fe Institute** - Has a range of programs that serves a pipeline of students from the middle school level up through professional development. Santa Fe Institute's programs aim to teach students science by doing science, preparing them for successful careers as science practitioners.
- ❖ **Santa Fe Public Schools*** - Santa Fe Public Schools is among the fastest improving districts in the state and strives to remove barriers, making every school in the district a great school for each child. Santa Fe Public Schools offers many opportunities to contribute to a child's life through volunteering. - ❖ **Santa Fe School for the Arts & Sciences** *- Provides summer and after school tutoring for SF Public School 3rd graders who are 1-2 years behind in reading through the Reading is Magic summer camp program. SFSAS also runs a mentorship program for our 8th grade students, connecting students to professionals in their chosen field.
- ❖ **Santa Fe University of Art & Design** - SFUAD seeks meaningful internship experiences for our Junior and Senior students (locally, regionally, nationally) to connect them with industry, enhance their professional development, and fuel post-grad employment.
- ❖ **School for Advanced Research--Indian Arts Research Center** - Our internships provide paid and unpaid training in the field of museums studies, specifically focusing on working with indigenous communities, cultures, and collections.
- ❖ **SIETE DEL NORTE, CDC - Inspire Santa Fe** is a new citywide youth mentoring program that unites young people (12-19 years old) with volunteer community members in an area of shared interest and passion, such as medicine, architecture, cooking, etc. The mentor and protégé work together 2 hours/week through the school year and showcase their work at an end-of-year festival.
- ❖ **Simon Charitable Foundation - Simon Scholars Program** - We provide weekly, individual tutoring for high school juniors and seniors selected to participate in our program. We serve cohorts of 20 juniors and 20 seniors from our partner high school located in Santa Fe and Albuquerque.
- ❖ **SITE Santa Fe** - SITE's Internship Program provides interns with meaningful opportunities in a working environment within a contemporary art museum. The SITE Scholar program gives students opportunities to network and work on projects that help them transition from student to professional artist. SITE's Young Curators Program, teaches high school students the curatorial side of the art experience, providing alternative ways for teens to connect with art while giving them a glimpse of possibilities within museum careers.
- ❖ **Teatro Paraguas** - Teatro Paraguas is committed to working with teens and young people from both native Hispanic and immigrant families. Young actors work alongside experienced adult actors onstage, gaining invaluable experience. We are open to partnerships with other arts organizations, non-profit service organizations and local businesses, as well as mentorships.
- ❖ **Warehouse 21** *- Warehouse 21 works with alums, seasoned youth and professional educators who mentor youth in the performing, media and visual arts. W21 supports youth interns in various aspects related to operations, administration, event management and program development. They are volunteers, paid stipends or hourly fees, or paid for commissioned work.
- ❖ **Wise Fool New Mexico** - WFNM provides internship opportunities through numerous universities nationwide and offers mentorships to local youth thru Monte Del Sol School.
- ❖ **Young Fathers of Santa Fe*** - Young Fathers of Santa Fe provides mentoring and case management to young fathers through one-on-one meetings and 6 weekly support groups throughout Santa Fe. YFSF delivered our FUTURE MEN PROJECT, which are two weekly mentoring service learning groups for 7th and 8th grade boys at Ortiz Middle School.
- ❖ **Youth Shelters and Family Services, Access! Program*** - Access! Training and Education Collaborative is a Department of Labor Funded program provided through Youth Shelters and Family Services. The program provides mentorships to students ages 14-24 and paid internships/mentorships to students ages 17.5 - 24. Students enrolled in the program have had, or are currently involved in the juvenile justice system to include teen and drug court. Students are assigned a community specialist and a community team for support. The program also provides wraparound services and financial assistance for concrete need fulfillment.
- ❖ **YOUTHWORKS***- YouthWorks operates a rolling, daily GED program for youth and young adults (ages 16-24). We feature group studies with licensed teachers and one-on-one tutoring. YouthWorks also features an apprenticeship program that connects young people to local businesses and employers for a 3 month subsidized apprenticeship placement. YouthWorks placed 65 young people in apprenticeships last year and will do the same or better this program year.
